


Lower cost - Small Satellite Platform for IoT and satellite Imaging

FUNDINGS

- Large Capital

- Women-led startups received just 2.3% of venture capital funding in 2020- Forbes
- The lack of gender equality in funding start-ups —

TALENTS

- Lack of talents with space background
- need more training
- still dominated by men

LEADERSHIP

- Fewer roles model good women leaders and mentor in industries
- Strong leadership to create a work culture

SUPPORT SYSTEM

- Lack of Networking
- Government support women entrepreneur program not suitable for space business
- Work -life balance?
